Lourdes Appeal: You may recall the media photographs of the devastating damage caused by the October 2012 flooding in the Lourdes area. However, insurance cover for the town properties and generous donations from local groups and organisations have enabled the area to be totally restored to normal.

Unfortunately, the Salford Diocese voluntary medical team of Doctors and Nurses, mainly from the Bolton area, have lost all their equipment and materials which were left in storage on site.
