There's a wonderful way in which the Christmas message emerges as we gather for the First Mass of Christmas: the first words of Scripture we hear are: "The people that walked in darkness have seen a great light." The mystery of Christmas is this - a great revelation: a light in the darkness, a star through the night, the birth of the Sun of Justice; the showing to the whole world of the love of God, made visible in Jesus. No wonder there is a great throng of the heavenly host shattering the darkness of the cold night on the hillside outside Bethlehem - because the invisible night of sin and sadness is shattered by the light of the Saviour's birth.

The gospel tells us that, at the visit of the shepherds, Mary "treasured all these things and pondered them in her heart." She became a faithful disciple of her son, was present at the foot of the cross, and was a witness to his resurrection.

In many ways this is our Christmas Feast, when we celebrate the Good News of the Saviour's birth revealed at last to us.

Hopefully you had chance to look at the display in the Harbour Room & Patmos Room to see the quiz answers.

There were 3 rough sleepers in Bolton. As the display said, Malcolm who slept rough in Astley Bridge was recently found on Dunscar Golf Course in a coma; sadly he died.

There are about 2000 homeless people in Bolton, the average age of those going to WinterWatch is 15-25 and the life expectancy of drug users is 28. WinterWatch operates from January to March and the average daily number of users during that period is 77.

On the New Year weekend, members of our Youth Group will make an appeal at the Masses. This will be very specifically for UHT Whole Milk which can be brought to church the following week and will then be taken to WinterWatch.

At the end of January, the SVP in both parishes will be organising a cake bake and the cakes will be taken to WinterWatch. [More details on next newsletter]
