## 6<sup>™</sup> APRIL 2014 FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT



The Gospel of the Fifth Sunday is perhaps the deepest meditation on the mystery of Baptism and membership of the Church. It is a prelude to the events of Easter Sunday, when we celebrate the triumph of life over death. To be plunged into the waters of baptism is to be buried with Christ, only to rise with him from the waters. This paradox of life and death is the content of today's readings. There is no more important part of our faith than the resurrection: that Christ rose from the dead is the very centre and heart of all that we believe - without it, our faith is useless. In the same way our belief in our

own resurrection is vital: it is the most deeply needed gift that Christ gives us. This is why the climax of the instructions given to candidates for Baptism was this teaching: that Christ would give them life after death. Look ahead to the 3rd Sunday of Easter, where Saint Peter preaches to the crowds – what he teaches them is that life comes after death, as it did for Lazarus, and for Christ himself.

Father Parkinson: It is now over twelve months since Bishop Brain appointed Father Parkinson to work with us here in our parishes (though he was only able to move here when St Brendan's Presbytery was renovated last July). He has, as you know, been splitting his time between his role as Chaplain to the Deaf Community and as Assistant Priest here. It was always the bishop's intention to review this situation after a period of time. This has now happened and the bishop has decided that Father Parkinson should give up his work with the Deaf Community (following their conference this weekend) and be full-time as Assistant Priest here. This is a welcome move from our point of view as it gives us the extra help and support that our parishes need in the short-term as we put the necessary structures in place for the three parishes being run (hopefully as a single parish with three churches) by one or two priests in the not too distant future.

**Walk of Witness:** The Palm Sunday Walk of Witness, organised by the Churches in Harwood, will begin with a short service at Christ's Church, Stitch-mi-Lane, Harwood at 2pm. We will stop for a moment of prayer at various points on the route as we make our way to St Brendan's for another short service. Our final destination is the Methodist Church Hall on Longsight where we will have Hot Cross Buns. We are grateful for the loan of a donkey for our procession and grateful to the RSPCA for providing a horsebox to transport the donkey. We hope that many of our parishioners will take part, including our schoolchildren and their families. You are all welcome to join in this walk of witness, even if you don't live in Harwood.
