

Fourteenth Week in Ordinary Time



We are called today to be messengers of peace; the Peace of Christ has left a mark upon us, and we have a duty to be the heralds of peace to our families and communities in this time and in this place.

In the final chapter of Isaiah, he speaks to us of a great river of peace flowing from God into our lives. He contrasts this river of peace with the peace of a baby at her mother's breast. We are called to rejoice in this peace and to be comforted as a child is comforted by his mother. The psalm continues this theme; it is a song of thanksgiving for the glorious works of God. The psalmist calls us to come and listen, for the Lord has listened to his prayer and has not withheld His love from him. These two passages remind us that in the midst of turmoil we need to turn to God and pray for peace. War will not bring peace; when all the swords of war are broken only love can establish a true peace among ourselves, and among the nations of our world.

When we hear the letters of Paul and read of his journeys in the Book of Acts, we meet a man who sought peace but was continually the subject of humiliation and strife. Through all these troubles Paul took refuge in the consolation of a crucified Christ. Now at the end of Galatians he seeks peace "I want no more trouble from anybody after this". Paul's peace was very close to him, it came from knowing he had served the Lord faithfully. Whenever we act in the name of peace, when we seek to heal divisions or bandage broken relationships then we too act in God's peace, we follow Christ. in His Way of Love.

When Jesus sent out the seventy-two, he sent them to take his peace to the people of Israel. He gave them instructions about how to behave; they were to take nothing for the road, his peace was sufficient for them. When they found a home blessed with peace they were to stay there. If they were not welcomed, then they should pass by and wipe off the very dust of that place. We too are called to go out to our neighbourhoods and act as peacemakers in our communities. This is a sign of our faith. We are to act in justice and love. There are many problems in our world which need our care and attention. The seventy-two came back, rejoicing; that joy is yours also when you act as a messenger of peace. *David Frank*
