## 12 February 2023 Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

We should always feel at peace in whichever church we choose to worship. There should be agreeting at the door and a friendly community inside. Today the readings may disturb our peace, the full version of the Gospel can sound very daunting, but if you listen closely to the readings, you will realise that, like a good parent, God prepares us for what life may send our way and His love is there to help us on our journey.

The writer of the Book of Ecclesiasticus offers us the two choices we have in this life, fire and water. It is up to ourselves to choose which one we take. If we choose to follow God then we choose water over fire. We are asked to keep His commandments. Life is a test which we may sometimes fail, but there is always forgiveness and a chance to try again.

Paul knows that we are faced with the temptations of this world, power, wealth, status, all these false gods which lead us astray. He believes in the wisdom of God, which is beyond our understanding, but which will lead us to eternal glory. This is not human wisdom; it is led by the Spirit bringing us into the mystery of God. Have you ever wondered how we react when something is before us and we know instinctively whether it is bad or good? How we perceive the rightness of an action before we even act? We are not perfect but the Spirit of God leads us to that perfection which is God's gift to us.

We may have learned the Ten Commandments when we were children. In my schooldays, seventy years ago, they were part of the Catechism which we learned to recite. The ideas behind those commandments are just as relevant today as when Moses received them, written on stone, from God in the desert. Just because thousands of years have passed they have not become redundant or outdated. When Jesus speaks about not abolishing the Law, he is stressing its importance even down to today. The Law is at the centre of a virtuous heart, the bedrock on which society can live up to the ideals of human life. Be confident in the mercy ofGod for following the teaching of Christ is the key to Kingdom of Heaven. **David Frank**
