26 March 2023 Fifth Sunday of Lent



During my schooldays, a long time ago, we were taught to pray but not about prayer. We learnt the usual prayers, the Our Father, the Hail Mary and the Glory be and lots of prayers about Our Lady and the Sacraments, but we were never given any guidance on how to pray and why we should pray. The psalms were seldom mentioned but two examples of the prayers of our Old Testament remain with me; Psalm 22 The Lord is my shepherd and Psalm 129 Out of the depths I cry unto you, my Lord. Today we have Psalm 129 as our Responsorial Psalm. It is a prayer for forgiveness and mercy; as we pray the psalm today, we pray for a world that is becoming blind to the love of God and, we hope that, by our prayers, we can turn the tide and reveal God's love to all.

We are now on the cusp of Holy Week and Lent is coming to its end. Our readings speak to us of the spiritual aspects of the season. Ezekiel's message reminds us of the Lord's promise "I will put my spirit in you and you shall live." The prophet uses the symbolism of the grave to remind the people that they have died for their sins and the Lord, in His mercy, has opened their graves and forgiven them. How often are our hearts full of sadness for the sins we have committed; the Lord wants to forgive our sins and open our hearts to His love. Saint Paul continues this theme; he contrasts those who are dead through sin with those who find life through the Spirit of God living in them. If we believe in Christ then that Spirit lives in us and, just as Jesus was raised from the dead, we too will find new life in Him.

We hear two voices in today's Gospel, Martha, the homemaker, whose belief in Jesus is unwavering and Mary, the dreamer, prone to melancholy and rashness, whose actions seem to imply a real sense of someone filled with the Spirit of God. Both have faith in the power of Christ to raise from the depths the body of their brother, Lazarus, but who also understand the message of eternal life, that death will be defeated through Jesus, the Resurrection and the Life. Jesus shows today his very human side, He weeps at the death of His friend Lazarus but, because He knows that death is not the end, He shows His divine power by raising him from the dead and revealing the glory of God. *David Frank*
