29 October 2023 Thirtieth Sunday Ordinary Time

The world is becoming a very small place; sixty years ago, you seldom met anyone who lived outside a small geographical area. If you did not travel, then you seldom met with "strangers". Today there are many different nationalities living in our towns, we meet them in our neighbourhoods, at work, and in our parishes. They do not remain strangers but become friends and work colleagues; they are very much a part of our communities. To the Jewish people, with their laws and customs, the stranger was outside their society, and it was difficult for them to accept "gentiles" into their lives. The passage from Exodus is a reminder that, if we do not love, then how can we expect to be loved by God in return. We must always be ready to put aside our concern for other cultures and embrace the friendship of the "stranger".

Paul was caught between two worlds; He was a Jew and always spoke firstly to those of his race who would listen to the Good News, but he recognised that his mission was also to the Gentiles. He made no distinction between the two. Perhaps this was the way of life that he speaks about today. The church welcomed everyone, Jews or Gentiles, who came to believe in Christ Jesus, a place was created where all worshipped together. This was not the normal way that people behaved two thousand years ago. But it worked. Hopefully we have learned a great deal more tolerance today.

Matthew's Gospel speaks of the greatest commandment; the message is clear and concise, it cannot be misunderstood, and there are no ifs and buts. Love must be at the centre of your every thought, word, and action, to serve God you must serve your neighbour. Loving everybody is not easy; we each have our own view on society and some people find it difficult to love, while others are difficult to love because of their nature. Love needs to be worked at, problems need solutions through prayer, sacrifice, and acceptance. Sometimes our love seems to be all one way, but we must persevere. If we follow Christ's teaching; eventually, we will see the reward for our persistence: a world filled to overflowing with God's love.
