"Watch early for wisdom": wise words, and ones that the foolish bridesmaids of the Gospel should have taken to heart. This is the ultimate in 'putting off till tomorrow...', since the reading is about the end of time, when the Son of Man will come again. Then there will be no tomorrow. If a thing is worth doing, it's worth doing today. Quite often we contemplate the end of time with anxiety and fear: this is not what God wants. Look at the Psalm, where we hear of desperate longing, a thirst for the Lord, that cannot wait. We should not just wait for the Lord with patient endurance, but with impatient longing: what could we desire more than the coming of the Lord, the rising of the dead and an eternity of joy and glory?

New Sunday Mass Times

The bishop has now approved the new times for our Sunday Masses here in the parish of Corpus Christi. They are 5pm Sat at St Brendan's, 9am Sun at St John's and 11am Sun at St Brendan's. They will take effect from next weekend.

Of the 62 people who voted for the Saturday 5pm Mass to move to St Brendan's, only 14 live in Tonge Moor and of that 14 only 2 or 3 walk to church and only 5 or 6 catch a bus. If you are driving there and you know someone who needs a lift, why not offer to pick them up? If you are a person who needs a lift and you know someone who drives, why not ask them to take you? This is not only a practical step but it helps build up our community. Please take care of one another.

Annual Second Collection for Retired Priests: There are currently some 60 retired priests of the Diocese of Salford.
