

Parish of Corpus Christi, Bolton 11 February 2018 Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time





Thankfully, we do not encounter leprosy in our culture. It can therefore be difficult to enter into the real depth of today's readings. We have to understand that leprosy meant exclusion, rejection and the end of "normal" life. For your leprosy to be

cured would be like being given a second chance at life. What is the cause of exclusion and rejection in our society - or even in the Church? Who are those who must "live apart"? And how can we put into effect in our day those most touching of the words of Jesus, when asked if he wants to cure the leper: "Of course I want to!"? Contemplating exclusion and rejection in our world can be hard work: Saint Paul guides the way: the Christian path is not to work "for my own advantage, but for the advantage of everybody else".

Think Vocation: St Paul tells us to model ourselves on Christ. Jesus had time for those who were pushed away by society and the authorities. There are people in the Church today who strive to ensure that no one is excluded from the Lord's love. We pray for those who work with the homeless and marginalised to feed them, shelter them and show them the love of Christ.

Marriage Matters: Sometimes we have a sense of being at odds and separated from each other. The question, often unasked, is 'do you love me?' The answer is the same as Jesus gave to the outcast leper 'of course I do!' From being apart, we can be one again. How often do we say to each other 'I love you'?

Corpus Christi SVP

Our parish of Corpus Christi has an active SVP (Society of St Vincent de Paul) with a total of 20 Members. Most of our work involves visiting elderly members of the parish, mainly those who live alone and therefore benefit from a chat with a friendly face - for a few, we might be the only person they've seen that week; most of these live in their own homes but we also visit Care Homes and, if required, parishioners who are in hospital.

At least twice a year we arrange a trip for such parishioners to other parishes for a talk, Benediction and afternoon tea. However, we also support families and individuals who are experiencing financial difficulties, paying for clothing, energy bills and short holidays, for example; at Christmas we supply food hampers and children's presents to families who would otherwise do without.

Beyond the parish boundary, in keeping with our role as a "missionary parish", we support the Destitution Project in Bolton through your donations to our appeals for food and clothing. We also provide a small amount of financial support to two SVP groups in Kerala, India, to help them provide for people in need in their parishes (aid that is very gratefully received).

We very much appreciate the financial support you give us through our church collections and we always look to spend that money wisely and efficiently.

Can you do more?

We always welcome new members. The commitment is a weekly meeting and a visit, both generally lasting 45-60 minutes but always subject to your own personal/family commitments.

Are <u>YOU</u> interested in joining us in this work, or would like more information on what is involved?

We meet at St John's Church on Monday's at 7.45 pm, St Brendan's Church on Tuesday's at 7.15pm. Hopefully one of these times will be suitable for you. Please feel free to attend either of these meetings without any obligation.
