


# Parish of Corpus Christi, Bolton

29 April 2018

The Fifth Sunday of Easter



Last week it was sheep: this week, the vine. Jesus offers us another (agricultural) image to explain the mystery of his offering of himself, and our belonging to him, our being part of him, which comes about through the sacrament of Baptism. This is, as was stated earlier, the period of Mystagogy,

when the newly baptised are helped to see what life in Jesus Christ really means. Today this comes out strongly for all of us, with two of the three readings emphasising the moral aspects of life in Christ: it is not simply enough to “belong” to him: our belonging must be shown by the works we do, by the fruits we bear - while remembering of course that we cannot bear fruit except in him.

### Marriage Matters

**Listening and discerning together:** Jesus says “Whoever remains in me bears fruit in plenty.” Listening to Our Lord is essential for our fruitfulness. This can depend on how well we make the time to listen to each other, to discern together. Often God speaks to us through our spouse; some say ‘the closer we are to each other, the closer we are to God’.

### Think Vocation

It is understandable how difficult the disciples found Saul’s radical change of heart and direction towards Christ. Even today the Lord can invite people to radically change their way of living to serve in the Church. Let us ask St Paul’s guidance and help for those who feel called to radically change the direction of their lives.

**St Brendan's School:** As you know, the school had its Religious Education Inspection at the end of March, just before breaking up for the Easter holiday. Consequently, it has taken a little longer than usual to receive the report from the diocese. The inspection covers five areas - The overall effectiveness of the school, the quality of Catholic leadership, the Catholic life of the school, the quality of Religious Education and the quality of worship. Each of these was judged to be Grade 1 which means the school is outstanding in all areas. The report sums this up by saying "Since the previous inspection, which also graded the school outstanding in all areas, the identified areas for development have been met in full and the school has continued to develop and move forward as a result of exceptional leadership." This is a great legacy for our headteacher, Mrs Kwiatkowski, as she moves to new pastures after the summer holiday. Governors are continuing the recruitment process and are pleased to inform you that Mrs Brindley will be Acting Head Teacher from September. Well done to everyone concerned in achieving this great inspection outcome.
