


Both first reading and Gospel today invite us to be “down to earth” about the Law of God. It’s very easy to become an “expert in religion” - knowing all the right

answers, remembering all the right quotes, and so on. But for Moses and for Jesus, if God’s Law is to be kept anywhere, it must be in our hearts and in our everyday lives. We are not to be concerned with keeping our eyes fixed on heaven, if it means that we cannot see the poor man at our feet.

Marriage Matters

Bandaging each other’s wounds: The Good Samaritan ‘*went up and bandaged his wounds, pouring wine and oil on them*’. On the journey of life, we wound ourselves and each other by our words, actions and omissions: our angry words, the withdrawal of affection, the broken promise. Open, honest dialogue ‘oils’ intimacy and we bind up each other’s wounds by asking and granting forgiveness.

Think Vocation

Jesus, the Master teacher gives us the image of the Good Samaritan. In many ways Jesus himself is the Good Samaritan. Like the Good Samaritan, Christ will not pass us by, he will always be compassionate to us, he will always take a risk on us and he will use all that he has to give us what we need. We are asked to imitate Christ, the Good Samaritan, and draw others to know him and love him.

Sacred Hospitality is our theme: as the letter to the Hebrews says: “remember always to welcome strangers, for by doing this some people have entertained angels without knowing it.” True hospitality lies in two things: first the welcome, encouraging the stranger to enter the house and be

at home there: secondly, the gift - not just of food or drink, but of time: listening to the stranger, and giving of ourselves to them. This is what makes hospitality costly, but holy, and a true service of Jesus Christ.

Think Vocation

“Mary has chosen the better part.” Within the Church there is a variety of apostolic work to be done. Priests and Religious live busy lives in all their daily tasks and duties but are asked to ensure they make time for the Lord in prayer. We pray for vocations to the religious communities who dedicate themselves to contemplative prayer. This is a powerhouse behind all the good apostolic work that is done in the name of the Lord.

Marriage Matters

Choosing ‘the better part’ is listening: The Gospel relates the different ways Martha and Mary behaved. We too can fall into such patterns of behaviour. It’s human nature to “worry and fret over so many things”. Today’s Scripture calls us to really listen, then, like Mary, we can choose “*the better part*”. Let us recommit today to deepening our level of listening in our marriage.

Sea Sunday - a Day of Special Prayer for Seafarers

Loneliness, danger and separation from loved ones are just some of the problems seafarers face. Around the world, night and day, The Mission to Seafarers provides help and support to those in need. As a Christian agency, we operate in more than 230 ports caring for the practical and spiritual welfare of seafarers of all nationalities and faiths. Sea Sunday is a day set aside in the Church's calendar to remember seafarers and to pray for them, their families and those that serve them. It began in 1975 when the three Christian maritime missionary societies, The Mission to Seafarers (Anglican), the Apostleship of the Sea (Roman Catholic) and the Sailors' Society (Free Church) decided there should be a day in which the contributions of seafarers to the country were recognised. Sea Sunday has gone on to become an international day with services, parades and ship blessings.

Seafarers' Prayer

O Mary, Star of the Sea, light of every ocean, guide seafarers across all dark and stormy seas that they may reach the haven of peace and light prepared in Him who calmed the sea. As we set forth upon the oceans of the world and cross the deserts of our time, show us, O Mary, the fruit of your womb, for without your Son we are lost. Pray that we will never fail on life's journey, that in heart and mind, in word and deed, in days of turmoil and in days of calm, we will always look to Christ and say, "Who is this that even wind and sea obey him?"
