## Thirty-Third Week of Ordinary Time





As we approach the end of that part of Saint Luke's Gospel before the Passion narratives, and approach the end of the Church's year, our thoughts are turned towards the end of time and the Second Coming

of the Lord - this will lead us into Advent in two weeks' time. Saint Luke's message is very distinctive: the Lord will come, but there is a lot to be lived through first. The coming of the Lord is not going to be a "quick fix" - we will have to live through (and endure) all the mess of human joy and suffering. The Lord is clear too, that we have to be aware of the personal cost of belonging to him - think back to last week's readings and the stories of religious persecution from every place and every age, even to this day. Even as this sounds gloomy and depressing, it is worth noting where the Gospel passage starts - in the material beauty of the Temple - and where it ends - something far more precious will be saved: our lives.

### **Marriage Matters**

Go on quietly working at our marriage, stand before God together: In marriage, one partner can work hard at the relationship, the other take it for granted. When both work at it, marriage can be the most marvellous relationship possible. Today, take time to stand before God together and 'the sun of righteousness will shine out with healing in its rays'. We all need this healing. Let's reaffirm our vows today.

#### Think Vocation

November is the month of the Holy Souls. We can all think of priests and Religious who have helped us on our journey of faith and have now died. In this Year of Faith, let us remember them in our prayers. It is also an opportunity to express our gratitude for their example and guidance.

# **Retired Clergy**

Some years ago, The Diocese of Salford established a Retired Priests' Fund to ensure all priests can receive the accommodation, care and support they need in their retirement. There are now 70 retired priests in the Diocese and more priests are expected to retire in the coming years. Many of these priests remain very active in retirement and often, when possible, provide support to parish clergy enabling them to take a period of holiday away from their parishes.

The Retired Priests' Fund covers needs such as:

- Assistance with housing
- · Assistance with living costs and accommodation
- · Care during convalescence
- · Nursing care for sick and infirm priests
- · Minor repairs and maintenance of accommodation

We aim to ensure that our priests, having retired from parish or other ministries, are financially secure. With a greater number of retired priests there is an increasing call on the Retired Priests' Fund to support them.

Most of our Diocesan priests work long into their late seventies, caring for the spiritual life and welfare of their people, often to the detriment of their own long-term welfare, and need care and support in their well-deserved retirement.

Each year we hold an Annual Appeal and Special Collection to build up the fund so that we can provide for our retired priests. This year the appeal is held this weekend and will take place as a second collection.
