Indeed, it is often the case that we overlook the simplicity of the Gospel message - which is why it is valuable to be as children, constantly wondering and marvelling at the beauty and fascination of Jesus. How much God must love us: the message of salvation is so easy to receive, the promise is so welcome. This is a Sunday to wallow in the wonder of a God who is 'kind and full of compassion.'

- Liturgy of the Word
- Liturgy of the Eucharist
- Concluding Rite

A New Translation

- The Roman Missal
- The Lectionary (in due course)

Elements of the Missal

- The Order of Mass
- The Proper for each day
- Ritual and Other Masses
- National Proper

What are the Main Changes?

- A more literal translation
- "New" responses to learn
- Revised versions of Confiteor, Gloria & Creed
- Considerable changes to what the priest says
- Invitation to sing more of the Mass

Introductory Rites (What they are & significant changes)

- Entrance procession and chant/song
- Sign of the Cross and Greeting
- Rite of Blessing and Sprinkling Holy Water
- Penitential Rite
- Kyrie (Lord, have mercy)
- Gloria
- Collect (Opening Prayer)

What are the challenges?

- Being "out of synch"
- Lapsing into the familiar
- A considerable period of transition
- Temporary missals/missalettes

What are the opportunities?

- Catechesis for a better understanding
- Catechesis for a greater participation
- Reflection on how we celebrate now
- Improving our celebrations
- New musical approach
