Last week it was sheep: this week, the vine. Jesus offers us another (agricultural) image to explain the mystery of his offering of himself, and our belonging to him, our being part of him, which comes about through the sacrament of Baptism. This is, as was stated earlier, the period of Mystagogy, when the newly baptised are helped to see what life in Jesus Christ really means. Today this comes out strongly for all of us, with two of the three readings emphasising the moral aspects of life in Christ: it is not simply enough to "belong" to him: our belonging must be shown by the works we do, by the fruits we bear - while remembering of course that we cannot bear fruit except in him.

The 80th annual Diocesan Pilgrimage to Lourdes, led by Bishop Brain, will take place between Tuesday 31 July and Monday 6 August 2012 and it is hoped that people from all over the Diocese of Salford will travel with the bishop and priests to Our Lady's shrine at Lourdes in France. Travel options include overland and by air, with an additional option for an overnight stop in Calais for those wishing to travel by train. Prices are available for overland travel from £510 (7 nights) and for air travel from £600 (6 nights).

Government Consultation on Marriage

Coalition for Marriage has set up a simple, easy web form that allows you to send your response directly to the Government's public consultation on redefining marriage. The consultation will play a key role in whether the proposal goes ahead or not. This is your chance to tell the Government you want to keep the true meaning of marriage.

The core issue – whether or not marriage should be redefined - is covered by Questions 1 and 2 of the consultation. Other questions cover the mechanics of how, not if, marriage should be redefined. We are urging our supporters to respond to the first two questions covering the core issue.

The consultation runs until 14 June. It is important that we get as many people as we can to respond. Virtually half-a-million people have signed our petition against the plans. It is vital that people also respond to the consultation to say they disagree with the proposal.
