### My flesh is real food and my blood is real drink



The Eucharist – the Body and Blood of Christ – is a mystery with so many layers and a depth that takes more than a lifetime to penetrate. It is not just a "thing" that we receive – however reverently – it is a person, a relationship, a belonging and a transformation that we consume, that becomes part of us: "Receive what you are – the Body of Christ". The readings invite us to reflect on how our celebration of the Eucharist brings Christ's words to our reality: "…who eats my flesh and drink my blood lives in me and I live in him." The people of the Old Testament had God living in their midst, walking with them on their journey, feeding and nourishing them with the gift of manna from heaven. Jesus walks with us, not looking on from afar,

journeying "in communion" with us – living within us, as we eat and drink the gifts he extends from the Last Supper. And as Saint Paul reminds us, our communion with the One Christ is also a communion with each other – God lives in us as the Church, as we become His Body.

Parish Priest and Rural Dean: Rev Michael Cooke

**Congratulations:** To Ella Elizabeth Delvard who was baptised at St John's last Saturday. We pray that she and her family may continue to grow in faith.

**New Canon:** Bishop Brain has appointed Father Cooke as a Canon of the Salford Cathedral Chapter. The duties of a canon are to pray for the people and the mission of the diocese by attending the monthly capitular Mass, preceded by a meeting of the canons. Church Law says that the role of the chapter of canons is "to celebrate the more solemn liturgical functions in the cathedral" and "to fulfil those roles entrusted to it by law or by the diocesan bishop." It also says "The diocesan bishop is to appoint to canonries only priests who are of sound doctrine and life and who have exercised a praiseworthy ministry." Father Cooke and another new canon will be installed at a Mass in Salford Cathedral on Wednesday 16 July, the Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel (Principal Patron of the Diocese).

**Thornleigh:** Pupils from the school have recently been awarded two significant prizes.

Three pupils from Year 9 (Adam Hall, Maria Antazo and Emmanuel Moro) were the overall winners of a competition run by the University of Bolton to help design a new university building. This was a prize of £10,000 with £1,000 going to the pupils and the rest to the school, together with a one-year University of Bolton Tuition Fees Scholarship to be awarded to any student from the school. More importantly, their spectacular design will now influence the final design of the new building.

Another two pupils from Year 9 (Owen Bond and Emma Jones) represented the school at the recent Observer Ethical Awards (featured in last Sunday's Observer magazine). The school's charity Mama Margaret's won the Ecover Young Green Champions award of  $\pounds$ 6,000 to help sustain the project. Mama Margaret's supports women in Dagoretti, one of the poorest slums in Nairobi, through the sale of hand-made craft items. Pupils throughout the school are involved, led by Mr Steve Burrowes.
