# They saw where he lived and stayed with him.

What does it mean to be a follower of the Lord Jesus? Surely to listen and hear his voice, and to go where he leads us. Today, as we enter the ordinary season of the year, we begin our story of Jesus' life and ministry with the calling of the first disciples. John fulfils his ministry - pointing to the Lamb of God - and the disciples follow where he points. His word to them is simple and inviting: Come and see. This echoes the calling of Samuel - a simple call, by name, which Samuel does not understand: discipleship is about trust, which Samuel shows simply by saying "Speak, Lord; your servant is listening." The Psalm also underlines this, as we (the disciples of the Lord) sing together: Here I am, Lord! I come to do your will. We hear his call, and we freely go to him, to listen again to the words of the Master.

Peace Sunday: Slavery and its ending is the theme of this year's World Day of Prayer for Peace in England and Wales this Sunday. Pope Francis chose the title, Slaves no more, but brothers and sisters. At the Last Supper Jesus told his disciples, 'I call you not servants but friends' and in the Letter to the Ephesians Paul speaks of a similar transformation for his Gentile readers: 'So you are no longer aliens or foreign visitors; you are fellow-citizens with the holy people of God and part of God's household'. We pray also for the ongoing work of Pax Christi, who work with all who share their values to abolish war and create communities of peace and justice.

Salford Diocese Lourdes Pilgrimage 31 July - 6 August 2015: A number of parishioners have asked about the possibility of organising a 3 Parish group to join the Diocesan Pilgrimage to Lourdes, this year led by our new Bishop the Rt. Rev. John Arnold. Teresa and I are intending to go anyway and would be only too pleased to organise a group booking if others are interested.

The Pilgrimage runs from 31 July – 6 August 2015 (6 nights) travelling by air from either Manchester or Liverpool and will be organised by Joe Walsh Tours in Manchester.

There are fewer hotels offered for selection this year than in previous years and having checked on line I would suggest that the Hotel Astoria Vatican offers good value. It scores highest on Trip Advisor and is the cheapest price. It states that the Hotel is slightly further from the Domain (300 metres as opposed to the 80 metres from the Hotel Irlande where we have previously stayed). This doesn't seem too much further to negotiate but should, perhaps, be considered if you have walking difficulties. We would hope to get wheelchair assistance if so required.

The price is £629 with an additional £26 if you take out the company insurance. Those requiring a single room however would need to pay an additional £150 and bearing this in mind it would be sensible to consider the possibility of joining in with friends in either a twin or triple room.

For booking purposes and in order to keep our proposed group together in the accommodation of our choice, I would be grateful if you could let me know your wishes as soon as possible.
