Ascension is not just a feast that happens to fall in Eastertide: it is an integral part of the Easter mystery. Remember the Lord's words at the Last Supper: "I am going to prepare a place for, and after I have gone and prepared you a place, I shall return to take you with me." The resurrection presumes the Lord's return to the Father. This is therefore a feast of hope: our hope in the Lord's return, as he went. Our hope that he will take us with him, when our bodies are raised as his was. Our hope that we will take our place in heaven, where he sits on the Father's right.

CAFOD Nepal Appeal: Thank you for the huge response over the last two weekends for this appeal. The total donated to CAFOD from our three parishes was a staggering £2503.70. Thank you for your support and prayers for this on-going crisis in Nepal.

Sacrament of Confirmation: Congratulations to all children from our three primary schools and beyond who were Confirmed at the services last week. Let us continue to pray for them as they continue on their journey of faith.

Patmos Room: The work to the extension of the Patmos Room will start on Monday 18 May. The overall project, including some landscaping works, will take about five months to complete, during which time we will need to use the two side doors for access to the church. You will notice that the contractors have already "moved in" and a number of their cabins have already been placed in the church grounds. After the Masses at St John's this weekend, access to the Patmos Room will not be available, therefore a portable WC will be made available outside the left hand side door of the church.

If you wish to learn more about this building project, there is a display in the Patmos Room and the architect (Keith Hamilton) will give a short talk about it after the 9.15 Mass this Sunday. We are confident that the building work will run smoothly, and we thank you for your patience and co-operation during the next few months.

Trip to Houghton Tower: A reminder that this trip departs from outside St. Brendan's church at 10.15am on Wednesday 20 May and should be returning at 3.15pm. A guided tour lasting about an hour awaits us upon our arrival at 11am. Lunch or snacks are available in the cafe. We have one spare place if anyone is interested in going. In order to gift aid your donations, which costs you nothing but gets an extra 25p per £1 for the church, you simply need to fill out a Gift Aid declaration once. If you are a taxpayer, please do consider signing one of these forms so that we can boost our income in this way. Even if you are not a taxpayer, you might wish to make your contributions by standing order rather than envelope or loose money. Chris Molyneux has kindly offered to be the Gift Aid Co-ordinator at St Columba's and he will be present at the back of church after the Masses this weekend with the necessary forms. Thank you.
