We hear the call of another prophet this week - Isaiah. This introduces the Gospel, where we see Jesus calling his first disciples to follow him. Notice that the initiative is Jesus'; there is no application process or interview procedure! Notice also the way that Jesus calls his disciples in this account - not with words, but with a miracle that is also a parable. It is, in a way, a miraculous "job description": if the disciple trusts completely in the one who calls, then the result

will be truly amazing - a huge catch of men and women hungry for God. Simon's simple words "if you say so" give us an example of Christian discipleship: we should leave our own concerns behind, and simply follow the Lord with great trust.

**Following on from last week's Pastoral Letter:** This week Bishop John held two meetings with all the priests of the diocese to begin a process of consultation regarding the future of parishes within the diocese. The bishop and priests have agreed on an initial proposal to reduce the number of parishes in the diocese from 150 to 75, recognising that some of these parishes may contain more than one church. Following these meetings, the second stage of the consultation will now be to ask the priests of each deanery - and the people in each deanery - to determine how we may best be missionary in our parishes and an evangelising people. In the coming months, the priests of each deanery will meet to discuss this and to come up with proposals for the way forward in re-aligning the number of parishes in their deanery, so that the overall reduction in parishes across the diocese may be made. Consultation on these proposals, with the people of each deanery, will then take place before any final decisions are made. Resources will be available to assist parishes when the agreed changes are to be implemented. In all these discussions and considerations, we ask the Lord to stay with us on our journey. *Bishop John Arnold*
