

The Re-Structuring of Parishes Within the Diocese A Proposal for Consultation

Since the *Preparing the Way* consultation in 2015, the Bishop has been working with the priests of the diocese to look at how the parishes might be re-structured and strengthened to be places where “we the missionary disciples are nourished and sustained in our Faith, in order to go out and serve the people who are in need of our Faith and love in the area”.

This weekend, the Bishop is making a consultation document available for parishioners to take in order to consider the proposals as to how the Diocese of Salford might re-structure. Before making any decisions, the Bishop would like to hear from parishioners around the diocese. The details of how to return your responses can be found at the back of the document. Your feedback is important and the consultation will remain open until 14 October.

Seafarers are commonly recruited from poorer countries and work in difficult and often dangerous conditions suffering from loneliness, spiritual deprivation and even exploitation as they transport the goods we use and consume every day.

The Apostleship of the Sea is the official Maritime welfare agency of the Catholic Church in Great Britain and it reaches out to seafarers visiting our ports, offering pastoral and practical care and support.
