The message of God's forgiveness is one that we are familiar with, but which the Lord still wishes to emphasise. Our human approach to forgiveness is so often flawed – we hold grudges, erect barriers, make demands and establish conditions. Jesus wants to remind his listeners – and us – that God's forgiveness is overflowing and bountiful. Saint Paul was well aware of this: he had persecuted the Church, calling himself "the greatest of sinners"; and yet, thanks to the "inexhaustible patience" of God, he can count himself a believer. We must be

open to the gift of forgiveness for ourselves, and also (as the Parable of the Elder Brother shows) open to that forgiveness offered to others whom we would condemn.

September - SVP Awareness Month



The St Vincent de Paul Society (or as it is often known - the SVP) is an international Christian voluntary organisation dedicated to tackling poverty and disadvantage by providing practical assistance to those in need. The Society is a lay organization initially formed in Paris in 1833 by Blessed Frédéric Ozanam and his companions, and has been active in England & Wales since 1844. Placed under the Patronage of St Vincent de Paul, it is inspired by his thinking and works. It seeks, in the spirit of justice and charity, to help those who are suffering poverty in whatever form.

The SVP is non-discriminatory, helping those in need regardless of their faith, colour, race, status or sexual orientation. It is non-judgmental and does not make value judgments about those asking for assistance. In short, the Society will aim to help anyone in need if it is within the local membership's capability.

Our SVP Conferences have members who are unpaid volunteers that meet together weekly and carry out the work of the SVP in their own time. Here are some examples of the kinds of people we help: Socially isolated, Homeless, Families in need and Asylum seekers

"The knowledge of social well-being and of reform can be learned not from books, nor from the public platform, but in climbing the stairs to the poor person's garret, sitting by their bedside, feeling the same cold that pierces them, sharing the secrets of their lonely hearts and troubled minds." Visiting those in need and sitting side by side with them remains the core work of the Society. Regular visiting and building relationships based on trust and friendship are what gives the SVP its unique character. Visits are made to individuals and families, to the sick at home or in hospitals, to residential homes. Loneliness, especially among the elderly is growing, so members spend a lot of time visiting housebound people to prevent them from feeling isolated. Many appreciate a friendly face and enjoy a chat, knowing that someone cares

In the parishes of St Brendan's, St Columba's and St John's we are lucky to have two SVP conferences that help those in our own communities. Over the last twelve months we have made many visits to the sick and the housebound, raised money from a sponsored walk and a charity concert (helping 24 families which included 35 children at Christmas time with hampers and gift vouchers). We also continue to support the volunteers at the Destitution Project and with your generous help we have sent many food and clothing parcels to desperate people in Bolton. We also organize two special Masses per year; one for the sick and housebound and one for the lately deceased in our parishes. As well as this, the elderly and housebound are taken out to visit another church in the diocese for Benediction and afternoon tea. In the summer we held our own afternoon tea in the Patmos Room, which was enjoyed by everyone.
