"Sheep without a shepherd." This is the simple theme of today's readings. It is interesting that Jesus' reaction to the crowd is one of pity - as he sees their great thirst for his teachings. This is, in a sense, a clear fulfilment of the prophecy we hear in the first

reading, where God promises a true shepherd who will care for the people of Israel. Shepherding is a particularly suitable image of God's love and care. The dependency of the sheep on their shepherd, their wandering and drifting without someone to guide them, is also a suitable image of the people God loves. Our own age also displays sheep without shepherds - a great wandering crowd, seeking something, but not knowing what they are seeking. It is to this flock that the present-day followers of Jesus are sent as shepherds.

Marriage Matters

Walking alongside or away? Jesus, the Good Shepherd, experienced rejection: many "walked with him no longer". This offers us some consolation, when despite doing our best to pass on our faith in Jesus and His Church to our children, we, their 'shepherds', experience them drifting away from the faith. God loves our children unconditionally, and we need to continually 'hold them' in our love.

Think Vocation

In the Gospel the crowds are longing for the hope and encouragement that comes from the lips of Our Lord. Could we spend more time acquainting ourselves with the Word of God in the Sacred Scriptures? Do we try to take at least one word or phrase from the homily, prayers and readings from the Sunday Mass to nourish us in the week ahead? Welcome to Corpus Christi.

This weekend we warmly welcome our new Parish Priest, Fr David Chinnery. We hope that Fr David enjoys living and ministering in our parish and we pray that he has a long and happy time with us.

Born and raised in Eccles, Greater Manchester, to Tommy and Sarah, his parents and with Stephen and Ann-Marie his younger brother and sister, respectively. David served at his local parish of St Mary's from the age of seven to eighteen at All Saints Franciscan Friary, Barton on the first Saturday of each month. He attended St Patrick's R.C. High School, Winton, De La Salle College, Weaste and Salford College.

In 1995 Bishop Kelly accepted David to study for the priesthood and was sent to Campion House, Osterley for a year and to St Cuthbert's Seminary, Ushaw, Durham for six years where he was ordained Deacon in 2001 by Archbishop Kelly. The following year he was ordained priest in his home parish of St Mary's, Eccles on 7 December 2002 by Bishop Brain.

Fr David's ministry has been varied and has reached from one end of the Diocese to the other. From 2002 to 2005 he served as an assistant priest to Fr Brendan Curley at St Cuthbert's Church, Withington in South Manchester and as a chaplain to The Christie with the late Fr Dave McGarry. Bishop Brain then appointed Fr David hospital chaplain to the Royal Blackburn where he served for 6 years. He also took up assistant appointments at St Joseph's, Darwen to the late, Fr David Foster from 2005 - 2006 and St Peter in Chains' to Fr Stephen Doyle and later to Fr Tony Dutton from 2006 - 2009. Then the last two years to 2011 spent as priest in charge of Holy Family in Blackburn at St Joseph's presbytery.

In the Summer of 2011 Fr David was appointed assistant priest to Fr Paul Mitcheson at St Wilfrid's, Longridge and has enjoyed seven years ministry. After Fr Paul retired at Easter 2012, Fr David was made parish priest. Two years to the date, the late, Fr Foster retired from Ss Peter and Paul's, Ribchester for Fr David to take charge. The following year in the December of 2015, the late Fr Anthony Grimshaw retired from St Mary's, Chipping for a short retirement, God rest his soul.

Fr David looks forward to moving to Corpus Christi Parish and to serve as her parish priest to St John's, Bromley Cross and St Brendan's, Harwood. He will be celebrating the Sunday Masses this weekend and is looking forward to meeting and speaking with parishioners. Fr David hopes to do his best in celebrating the sacraments and preaching the Gospel and being your priest. Summer Holidays: Our schools have now finished for the summer holidays. It is a time to thank all members of staff for all their professional dedication and hard work during the last academic year. Urban Outreach (Bolton Lunches): More than one in five school children are eligible for free school meals in Bolton due to low incomes that's 8,600 children! During the summer school holidays, these families face a six-week struggle to find the money to feed their children.

In response to a concerned community in Bolton who wanted to help, we launched Bolton Lunches. In partnership with local children's centres, churches, businesses, and an army of volunteers we make up packed lunches feeding thousands of individual children in the school summer holidays.

Around 50 volunteers assemble each weekday at 7.15am to make around 1500 lunches consisting of a ham, cheese or tuna roll, a carton of fruit juice, a cereal bar, a pack of mini cheese biscuits and a piece of fruit. Over the summer holidays that's more than 43,000 packed lunches! The lunches are taken to more than 20 community venues where children and their parents pick them up. In 2018 Bolton Lunches will run from 23 July - 31 August.
