Again, we hear about the coming "Day of Christ", and meet the character of John the Baptist. Just as once before he "prepared the way" for the coming of Christ, so today he does the same for us. Our hearts should be open to his

voice, as he calls us to repentance, and asks us to make the way straight for the coming of our Lord. The imagery of this Sunday is particularly rich: the dominant image is of a vast population moving together - the return from exile in the first reading, the going and coming of the sowers in the psalm, the community of the Church preparing together in Paul's letter. We prepare for the coming of the Lord as His people - a community who cooperate to make the "processional way" of the Holy One - flattening the hills of opposition and ridicule, filling in the valleys of doubt and despair, so that "all mankind shall see the salvation of God."

Marriage Matters

Smoothing out rough ways...to welcome You: Paul speaks of our 'partnership in the Gospel' and prays that our love continues growing. He wants us to 'come to true discernment' about our choices. Luke's Gospel challenges us as married couples: are we enabling each other to 'prepare a way for the Lord'? Are there 'paths' that need 'straightening' or 'rough' attitudes/behaviours that need to be made smooth?

Think Vocation

St John the Baptist was the voice that cries in the wilderness asking people to prepare a way for the Lord and to change their ways. Like John, the voice of the Church can seem to be a voice in the wilderness of our world. It might not be a message that the world wants to hear but it needs to hear it. May others be called to serve in the Church as a voice for the Lord for his people today. Edward Hays, A Pilgrim's Almanac



Advent is the perfect time to clear and prepare the Way. Advent is a winter training camp for those who desire peace. By reflection and prayer, by reading and meditation, we can make our hearts a place where a blessing of peace would desire to abide and where the birth of the Prince of Peace might take place.

Daily we can make an Advent examination. Are there any feelings of discrimination toward race, sex, or religion? Is there a lingering resentment, an

unforgiven injury living in our hearts? Do we look down upon others of lesser social standing or educational achievement? Are we generous with the gifts that have been given to us, seeing ourselves as their stewards and not their owners? Are we reverent of others, their ideas and needs, and of creation? These and other questions become Advent lights by which we may search the deep, dark corners of our hearts.

Sister Monica Byrne

At the end of last month after Mass in Saint Ethelbert's Church in Bolton, Sister Monica was presented with the Bene Merenti Medal, awarded to her by Pope Francis for her many years of faithful service to the Catholic Church and the wider community.

The Medal and citation were presented to her by Sister Therese O'Regan CP, Provincial Leadership Team Leader of the Cross and Passion Sisters, in the presence of Father Morrough O'Brien PP and parishioners. In making the presentation, Sister Therese recalled Sister Monica's lifetime's work as a teacher and later as a Community Volunteer. There was, she said, something very special about Sister Monica as she recalled how she has now completed almost 64 years of unbroken service to Bolton's Catholic community and to the wider Bolton Family and how for over 30 of those years she has officially been retired! Later this month, Sister Monica will finally be leaving Bolton to take up residence in her Order's Retirement Home in Lytham. She will, indeed, be a great loss not only to Bolton's Catholic community but also to the wider Bolton Family whom she has so faithfully and assiduously served in so many capacities. We wish her a long and happy retirement!
