#### The Hour has Come

The season of Eastertide is coming to a close and today we hear the final part of the Last Supper discourse in which Jesus completes his teaching to the Apostles through a prayer to the Father for them to remain united in Him and in the Father. His time of sacrifice is now upon Him yet His thoughts, as always, turn to His followers and the trials they must endure for His sake. Whenever we say the "Our Father" we recall both the blessing of this prayer, which he has taught us through the Gospels, and these words at the Last Supper which repeat and expand the petitions of that prayer.

In the first reading the apostles take "a sabbath walk", a Sunday stroll, in the warm afternoon air. The mood is sombre, silence is upon them. their Lord has gone from them, ascended to His Father, and they are alone once more.

We cannot imagine the mood; to have lost then regained their saviour and to have been parted from Him again, in what must seem a final time creates among them a feeling of sorrow but also of anticipation. Jesus has told them they are not as orphans, but members of a heavenly family united in spirit and truth and though they will experience times of trial, times of joy, they will never feel alone and abandoned again. They return to the upper room, their place of safety, a place which we seek when fear and confusion come upon us. Instead of drowning in sorrow, they begin to pray.

There are times, in this dreadful period of selfisolation and exclusion from our place
worship and our sacraments, that we too may
feel abandoned. Through the gifts of
technology, we can keep in touch with each
other over the phone and the internet but
that does not replace the companionship we
have enjoyed as part of the universal church.
The human contact, which is so necessary for
our comfort and mental well-being, is missing
and we too take our small sabbath walks for
exercise, often silently, with our thoughts in
turmoil.

We miss our families, our friends, our community, our God. But this is not the end.
Our Lord may not be with us in a physical form, but we have an advocate, the Holy Spirit, who brings us hope and connects us, through the Blessed Trinity, to Jesus and Our Father in heaven. The early church could have faded away, the apostle and disciples scattered, hearts broken, in the hills and lakes of Galilee, but they were not, and we too, through the Spirit working within us, will see a brighter day tomorrow when all the pain and confusion will fade and we will be free to serve our God and our neighbour aga
