#### "We always mention you in our prayers and thank God for you all".

Everyone is loved by God. There are no exceptions. God created us and loves us: no matter what our beliefs or way of life, we are cherished and held by our loving Father. There are many who do not know God and there are those who have turned away from God and who place their trust in worldly things. God reveals himself in many ways and we believe he has revealed himself to us through His Son, Jesus Christ. It is impossible to know the mind of God, to understand His ways. Isaiah is trying to make sense of the actions of Cyrus, a pagan and King of Persia, who has conquered Babylonia and released the Israelites from captivity. Cyrus does not know God, yet he does His bidding, returning the Jews to their homeland and rebuilding the Temple. This reminds us that God works through whoever He chooses, "Though you do not know me, I arm you that men may know from the rising to the setting of the sun, that, apart from me, all is nothing".

In the Gospel passage Jesus is handed a coin and asks, "Whose head is this?", in reply to the Pharisees and Herodians who are trying to trap him into an injudicious answer. Caesar's image represents the things of this world, a world that holds the Israelites in slavery to a foreign power, a world of false idols and deities. The real image, the face we see in our family and neighbours, is an image of our God, for we are made in his likeness, and even though we use many things of this world for earthy needs, our allegiance is always to our heavenly Father.

Paul, at the beginning of his letter to the Thessalonians, writes to their church and reminds them of the basic building blocks of God's purpose in the world. He speaks of a community dedicated to faith in action, a people working for love and persevering in hope. In light of today's epidemic can you see how Paul relates to our problems today. There are no easy fixes but if we keep faith, work together in love and persevere in our hope for a brighter future then we can emerge from this time stronger communities and Diocese strengthened by the faith and conviction of the people of God. ## Diploma in Pastoral Ministry and Leadership

Once again, this year the Diocese, in partnership with the Archdiocese of Liverpool and Wrexham Diocese, are offering a Diploma in Pastoral Ministry and Leadership. The Diploma is a combination of Online Learning and a series of leadership workshops, leading to a Loyola University Chicago Certificate and a series of Liverpool Hope CPD Awards. The course starts in January 2021 and ends in December 2023. The full Diploma costs £2500, which is payable over three instalments.
