

30 January 2022 Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time



Today's readings give us an insight into the characters of these individuals. The Prophets of the Old Testament had an unwavering faith in God. They came from unlikely backgrounds, their belief in themselves was somewhat shaky but they were convinced that God was on their side and that He would triumph. The reading from Jeremiah reminds me of a modern-day prophet, Martin Luther King. He believed that the God of love would not tolerate the injustices that were suffered by his people and he believed he was being asked to stand up for them. He spoke eloquently and passionately against the plight of the black people of America and confronted the powerful in the land. He was not overcome, and his cause was carried on through the lives of the people who stood with him and who triumphed through their unity. As with many of the prophets he took the crown of martyrdom, but he was not defeated. The power of God has the ability to achieve what it sets out to do.

Paul speaks of the higher gifts. He recognises that the driving force behind all those who seek for justice is love. With love we can do almost everything, without love our achievements will be blown away in the wind. When we are faced with problems, with difficulties, our only sure hope is love. All human gifts come to a close, in the end, all we have left is love.

When Jesus began his ministry, he knew that some of the things he had to say would not be accepted by his listeners. He does not hide from those who will not accept his words. He knows he speaks the truth and will not dilute his message. We can criticise the people of Nazareth for their reaction to the words of Jesus but before we do just consider one question. When faced with the facts of a situation how do you react? **David Frank**

New Guidance for Churches 2022 (Taken from Final document of Rev Canon Christopher Thomas 24 January 2022)

Now that the measures put in place by HM Government on 19th January (to mitigate against covid virus transmission as "Plan B") have now been lifted, we have received new guidance from the Bishops' Conference of England & Wales for safe church attendance:

Alongside the positive effects of covid vaccination, it should be stressed that any people displaying symptoms of Covid-19 should stay at home and not participate in acts of worship in church. This is good practice for any transmissible illness. Medical advice should be sought as appropriate for those who are ill.

The main form of virus transmission is via personal oral or nasal aerosol. Those attending an act of worship may continue to wear a face covering (both nose and mouth) whilst in the church building. There is no need for formal social distancing in church buildings, although those present should be sensitive to the needs of others around them.

Whilst it is still good practice to sanitise hands on entry and exit of churches, there is no need for readers (or other ministers) to sanitise their hands before reading or performing other ministries in the church. All ministers of Holy Communion (clergy and lay people) should still sanitise their hands for the distribution of Holy Communion.

Congregational singing may continue and there is a general encouragement to wear face coverings while singing.

Whilst this reduction of restrictions brings about a more normal way of living, the Covid-19 virus is still in circulation, and this should be in the mind of those participating in the life of the Church as time goes forward, holding in balance the need for personal safety and taking responsibility for that safety.




