8 January 2023 The Baptism of The Lord

On the threshold of a New Year, we begin again the Gospel stories of the Ministry of Our Lord. We look back over two thousand years to the beginning of the Good News, and in our scriptures, we go back even further to the creation stories and the words of the Prophets. When we do this, it is so important not to lose sight of what is to come; we can be so immersed in the past that we fail to understand that we live in the present day and that what we are to be is more important than what we are today.

Isaiah, in our first reading, is looking forward to the coming of the Servant of the Lord. He paints a portrait of a humble man, filled with the Spirit of God, who will act with integrity and justice. This is not the figure of a king or a warrior but of a man who cares for his people. One who will bring true justice into the lives of all the people and who seeks to free those who are blind, those who are in prison, those who live in darkness and bring them back into God's light.

Peter has seen God's light, he has followed Him through the Holy Land, sat with him at table, and listened to His word. Now enlightened by that light he realises that the mission of Jesus was not to the Jews alone but to all the peoples of the world. Led by the spirit he comes to the house of Cornelius, a pagan, a Roman, one who in the eyes of the Law was unclean. He sits at table with him, shares in his meal and speaks to him and his household about the Lord. He has come to realise that God does not have favourites; after the meal he baptises all who have found faith in Jesus Christ.

John begins the preparations for the coming of Christ; he leads the ordinary people to a baptism of repentance through washing away their sins in the waters of the Jordan. Now Jesus comes to him, He requires no distinction between Himself and the people gathered in this place. He is content to share in this baptism. We are all equal in the eyes of God and, as we enter this new year, the regrets of the past can be put aside if we seek forgiveness and can look forward to working for God's Kingdom and a new life in Christ. *David Frank*

A Note from Fr Alf: As we know Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, who served as Supreme Pontiff from April 2005 to February 2013, died aged 95, on New Year's Eve. A short statement from Matteo



Bruni, Director of the Holy See's Press Office, said: "With sorrow I inform you that the Pope Emeritus, Benedict XVI, passed away today at 9.34am in the Mater Ecclesiae Monastery in the Vatican." Cardinal Vincent Nichols, President of the Bishops' Conference, said:

"I am deeply saddened to learn of the death of Pope Benedict. He will be remembered as one of the great theologians of the 20th century.

"I remember with particular affection the remarkable Papal Visit to these lands in 2010. We saw his courtesy, his gentleness, the perceptiveness of his mind and the openness of his welcome to everybody that he met."

"He was through and through a gentleman, through and through a scholar, through and through a pastor, through and through a man of God - close to the Lord and always his humble servant."

"Pope Benedict is very much in my heart and in my prayers. I give thanks to God for his ministry and leadership."

May he and all the faithful departed rest in peace Amen
