## 10 December 2023 Second Sunday of Advent

Today's readings speak of a time of preparation. A time to take stock of how we are living these precious lives of ours and how we can be ready, be awake, for His coming into our hearts.

The people of Isaiah's time had grown tired of waiting for the Messiah and turned away from God into a life of sin. They had lived, as a nation, through a time of great upheaval, of slavery in a foreign land and now they were home again but still not at peace with God. Isaiah calls to them to prepare for the coming of the Lord. To level the valleys, to pull down the mountains, to make a way, through the wilderness of their lives, for the messenger of God. But this will not be a God of war, a God of conquest over all nations, this will be the Shepherd King, gathering the people together, holding them close, and leading them in peace to their eternal home.

Peter calls for patience, the Lord will come in His own time. We must be ready for His coming by living our lives without spot or stain, our hearts, havens of peace for the coming of our God.

Peace was far from the world of the evangelist Mark. He had seen the Christian community in Rome torn apart by betrayal of one another under the tyranny of Nero. In a noble attempt to heal and restore the communities he writes His Gospel, reminding them of the life and sacrifice of Christ and hoping to begin again the building of the church of God. Mark reminds his listeners that Isaiah's vision was made possible by the mission of John the Baptist, a strange figure, coming out of the wilderness and calling the people to a Baptism of repentance from their sins and announcing the arrival of "Someone" who would come after him, clothed with great power, one who would baptise the people, not with water, but with the Holy Spirit.

Advent never stands still; it rushes through the days not waiting for the unprepared. We are given this time to prepare, to make our hearts open, ready to hold the love of God and share it with all mankind. Do not delay, if you need to change do it now, for the time of the Lord is almost upon us.
