4th Sunday of Advent



We begin and end the fourth week of Advent today and enter the Christmas Season. If you have listened and taken note of the Advent message then you are awake, you have prepared well with prayer and patience, with laughter and, for some, tears. Now we are on the verge of the great feast of the Nativity of the Lord and He will soon be with us in the little child of Bethlehem.

There is a great contrast in our first reading, it speaks of building a great temple to God, a place for Him to dwell, yet, very soon, our God will come not to a palace but to a stable, not to wealthy parents but to a poor couple, homeless and needing shelter. God's ways are not our ways, His dwelling place on this earth is in our hearts not in some building. As Samuel reminds us, the house of David is a living family and from his descendants will come Christ.

As last week, we once again have the final words of one of Paul's letters, this time to the Romans. It is a reminder to us that Advent is a time to look forward as well as backwards, to a future coming of Christ in His glory. Paul speaks of the missionary work of the Church, of going out and broadcasting the Good News to all God's creation. This is our responsibility, the test of our faith, "part of the way the eternal God wants things to be.'

The Annunciation to Mary is a pivotal moment in God's plan for Humanity. We know very little about Mary, many things have been speculated about this extraordinary woman. We believe that she was chosen from conception to be the mother of the Son of God, but we are also aware that, as a human, she is free to choose her own way. As Gabriel finishes his message the whole of creation in essence holds their breath. Her reply "I am the handmaid of the Lord, let what you have said be done to me" changes history forever and now we can rejoice and be thankful. David Frank
