### The Third Sunday in Ordinary Time



The Psalms are known as the prayerbook of the people of ancient Israel, but they are more than just prayers. They are the dialogue between the chosen people and their saviour God. They are songs of praise and worship, words of hope and lamentation, wisdom and guidance, covering all the triumphs and tribulations of a people searching to find their way to God.

Today's psalm provides us with a way to make sense of today's readings which seem to be mismatched and difficult to follow. They are a guide to those chosen by God. If you are struggling for understanding do not loose heart, place your faith in the wisdom of God who never fails to help us in our understanding of the Word. Jonah was a reluctant prophet. He comes across as a man who has little faith in his fellow man and has no time for those who do not think the way he does. God chooses not as we choose; he seeks repentance from Jonah but does so by sending him among the disobedient people of Ninevah who have turned away from him and whom he has threatened to Jonah goes through this mighty city destroy. calling them to repentance. The people turn away from their wickedness, repent and ask for forgiveness and their prayers save them from the wrath of God.

Why does God choose one person and not another? Saint Paul wants to ensure all who believe in Christ are saved and he writes to the Corinthians begging them to put Jesus before all earthly thoughts. In the coming weeks we will read some difficult advice from Paul, but he speaks in this way because he wants everyone to live lives worthy of God and be saved. In the psalm we call upon God to teach us His ways. These ways are difficult, he calls us to serve him alone and this can cause difficulties in our personal life, but God never asks us to do something beyond our capabilities.

Fishermen are a hardy breed, they are independently minded and used to working through the calms and storms of life. Mark tells us that when Jesus calls Andrew and Simon Peter, James and John, they show no reluctance and drop everything to follow Him. Perhaps the words of today's psalm speak to them clearly "He guides the humble in the right path, he teaches his way to the poor". David Frank
