# Second Sunday of Easter - Divine Mercy



The Easter season poses a question which each of us must answer: What does the resurrection really mean? If you read the Book of Acts and the Gospel accounts of the period after Our Lord's resurrection you will be struck by two things; initially there is a great outpouring of the Spirit which spreads the Word across the known world but, after this period, there comes a test of faith through persecution, and this is when the real strengths of the people of God emerge.

The one thing that sustains the people of God through these trials is their faith and that faith is underlined by the resurrection of Jesus. It is impossible for us to imagine the effect that this event must have had on the apostles and disciples. It is clear from today's readings that it gave them a unique glimpse of the power of God working through Jesus. The Jews lived every day with their belief in an almighty God; one who would save them from all the evil that surrounded them. To actually witness this power will have changed them in a very special way.

Today's readings speak to us of a movement that sprang from the communities' faith in the resurrected Jesus; a community which shared everything and was united in spirit and in love. This group of individuals became one and began a journey which continues in many thousands of communities throughout the world today. John bases this movement in the love of God which has permeated down to our community and to the love we have for each other; a love that is strengthened by its sharing among us.

The events in the upper room are shared with us to show that Jesus died and rose again for each one of us. We are the disciples. There are even one or two Thomas's among us, and we know that Christ is risen and that, through His resurrection, we too will rise, with Him, in His chosen time. Today we suffer from a society which is indifferent to Christ; a society which seems to deny that the resurrection ever took place. If the resurrection means something to us then it is our responsibility to remind society, through the way we live, that Jesus is indeed risen, alleluia.

The Annunciation of the Lord: The Solemnity of the Annunciation is celebrated nine months before the Nativity of the Lord. The Annunciation recalls the day when the Archangel Gabriel appeared to Mary and revealed God's will that she become the Mother of the Son of God, and she accepted. At that moment, the "Word became Flesh and dwelt among us" (John 1:14). In 2024, because it would otherwise fall during Holy Week (25 March), the Annunciation will be observed on Monday, 8 April.
