There are many wonderful prayers which we can use to convey our feelings, hopes and sorrows to our Father in heaven but the greatest and the simplest is the "Our Father" which we come to today in the Gospel passage from Saint Luke. The most wonderful aspect of this prayer is the way that Jesus prays not to an "Almighty God" but simple to "Father". The intimacy of the relationship between father and son establishes our relationship with God and gives us an opportunity to cry out to him in our need "Abba, Father"

Many words have been written about this prayer. It has been prayed countless times, even in our own lifetime it would be impossible to say how many times we have stood, sat, knelt or even laid down and said these familiar words. They are as close to us as the breath in our bodies and as important to us as the blood in our veins.

We begin by giving God the dignity to which his name is held in our hearts. We ask Him for the grace to become his children and the courage to bring His kingdom to life in our world. We know that we are not capable of doing anything without his help and so we pray for the gift of His power, His bread, which fills our days with His presence. And we ask for forgiveness. Forgiveness is a simple act; it is what Abraham asks for the good people in the cities of Sodom and Gomorrah. It is a gift within our giving but Oh! so hard to give to others. If we can be forgiven, how can we deny forgiveness to those who hurt us? We are frail human beings, we do not have the capacity to stay true to our God and so we ask finally for His help to resist the temptations of this world.

Jesus knows our human nature; how we tend to give up too readily if we do not find what we are looking for. So, He urges us, be persistent, do not let go so easily, besiege heaven with your prayers and listen, listen carefully for often the answer comes in the form of a gift of the Holy Spirit. Special Appeal from the Columban Missionaries: The Columban Missionaries were founded in 1918 as the Irish (or "Maynooth") Mission to China. As the political situation in China worsened, culminating in the expulsion of all foreign missionaries from that country in 1952, they began doing parish work in other countries in Asia and around the rim of the Pacific, such as the Philippines, Korea, Burma (Myanmar), Pakistan, Fiji, Chile and Peru. John Boles was born and brought up in Stockport and worked as a Town Planning Officer before joining the Columbans. He has spent nearly all his missionary life in Latin America, most notably some 27 years in Lima, Peru, when he returned in July of last year. We welcome Fr Boles to our Masses this weekend as we take up a special collection for all the missionary work that Columban's carry out.
