There are two real choices in this world, and they are set before us today. We are free to choose to do good or to do evil. As Sirach tells us, "He has placed before you fire and water, stretch out your hand for whichever you wish". Our loving Father knows us, "he is mighty in power and sees everything"; so, the choice is ours, we can follow Him and live in love, or we can turn away from Him and live in sin.

Lent is a time when we can turn away from sin and return to His loving presence. In scripture you can find inspiration which will lead you in the right path.

One passage always comes to mind when I reflect on the path that leads to a Christian life, "This is what the Lord asks of you, to act justly, to love tenderly, to walk humbly with your God". If you follow these three principles, then the way will be open to you to reconciliation with the Father and He will welcome you back with great joy.

Saint Paul speaks to us of the "secret and hidden wisdom of God. This is not a human wisdom, for many have proclaimed wisdom but changing times have proved the futility of their thoughts, it is a wisdom given to us from the beginning of the world and it will lead us to God's glory. It is something that the eye has not seen nor heard or even imagined it is the glory that God has prepared for those who love him, and it is revealed to us through belief in the Spirit who dwells in us.

We are coming to the end of Matthew's passage on the Beatitudes. We may have come to realise that at the centre of Christ's teaching is the human Heart. It is in our hearts that the urge to do good or evil springs into life.

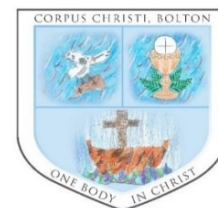
