If a thing is worth doing, it's worth doing today. Quite often we contemplate the end of time with anxiety and fear: this is not what God wants. Look at the Psalm, where we hear of desperate longing, a thirst for the Lord, that cannot wait. We should not just wait for the Lord with patient endurance, but with impatient longing: what could we desire more than the coming of the Lord, the rising of the dead and an eternity of joy and glory?

Basic Caring Communities: BaCC is an initiative of *pact* (prison advice and care trust), a charity which offers free training and support to those who want to put their faith into action to support ex-offenders wanting to make a fresh start on release from prison. The scheme is currently operating in Westminster, Southwark, Salford and Clifton dioceses and pact are recruiting volunteers in each of these areas. We will have an appeal (for volunteers not money) at the Masses next weekend. This will be given by Mgr Malachy Keegan the Bishops' Conference Prison Adviser.

Mass for the Deceased: During the month of November we traditionally pray for all our departed loved ones. We will have our annual Mass for all those who have died in the past year on Saturday 19 November at 11am. This year it will take place at St Brendan's.

Pilgrimages

Lourdes 2012: There have been a number of enquiries about a possible re-visit to Lourdes in the coming year. Lists are on the noticeboards in both churches for those who may be interested. Cost details are not yet known. However, based on this year's tariff, the expected price per person should be in the region of £600 to include travel and full board. The dates of the pilgrimage are Tuesday 31 July to Monday 6 August. *Terry Smith*

Rome & Assisi: I am delighted to say that the date for our 8 day parish pilgrimage to Rome & Assisi has now been set. It is Monday 17 September 2012 until Monday 24 September 2012 and is being organised through the services of McCabe Pilgrimages, an ecumenical company with established links in Italy for over 25 years and with whom members of the parish went to Oberammergau in 2010. The cost is £1345 per person sharing a twin-bedded room and includes many items normally extra on a holiday.

The tour is on half board basis with continental breakfast and evening meal being served at our hotel. We will travel around Rome in our own air-conditioned coach and have the services of an Italian tour manager. All entrance fees are included as well as British air passenger duty and all other airport taxes. We will fly to and from Manchester on scheduled flights with Jet 2.
